

FROM THE OVERAL

From 2015 to 2017, the budget allocated to culture has been progressively increasing, which is a positive sign indicating changes in strategies to boost the arts and culture sector.

Heritage

Three national public bodies under the Ministry of Culture are involved in protecting and managing heritage:

- National Heritage Institute INP
- The Directorate General of Heritage
- The Agency for the Development of Heritage and Cultural Promotion



Performing Arts

3.2 million TND in 2014 channeled through 3 support mechanisms:

- Production aid
- Distribution aid
- Assistance for the operation and equipping of theatrical spaces and associations



Music & Dance

550000 TND in 2013

 100 000 TND were awarded to dance against 50 000 TND in 2010




Books

- Subsidised local production with the compensation of paper cost
- Controlled editorial activity
- Liberalised book importation



Visual Arts

- Associations who implement art projects may be subsidised: maximum 5000 TND; 10000 TND grant per association to be validated by a commission, approved by the Minister
- A commission of the Ministry of Culture is entrusted of purchase of works of art twice a year from galleries approved by the Ministry
- Purchased art works are stored in a repository with very poor conditions for the conservation of such art works, and is run by personnel who lack adequate training
- 400 art works unknown to the public have been exhibited by the Fine Arts Department, for the first time in 2012
- A second exhibition was held in 2014



Cinema

5.5 million TND in 2013 channeled through the CNCI, established in 2012, and who signed a partnership agreement with the CNC France in 2013 to develop film cooperation between France and Tunisia

• The revision of legislation on the grant and dissemination of Tunisian films, dating from the 60s and 80s, gave a breath of fresh air to the sector. The production aid for 2015 exceeded 3.982 million dinars (1.794 million euros)

There are two production support commissions to provide:

- Aid with writing, production or finishing a feature film or a short film
- Support for non-subsidised producers (for the previous committee) purchase of film rights to broadcast with a non-commercial network, such as cultural centres, associations (cine clubs), schools, universities



Despite existing tax incentives, cultural patronage is rare in Tunisia; as the law allows producers to defer payments of employees social security contributions, reductions on the income tax and tax exemptions related to training


Paradoxically film festivals are well-attended

Performing Arts

There's a need for new and well-equipped theatre spaces knowing there are no less than 300 theatre festivals throughout the country that are international, national, and regional, with the best known, Carthage Theatre Days



Museums

The number of visitors has

dropped since 2011 in both: The Bardo Museum

 The archaeological museum of Sousse and Djerba

- - Music
- New bar concerts and new events are created at regional, national or international levels for young contemporary music (hip hop, rock, reggae, electronic)
- Parallel circuits and social networks have helped in the development of these players in the "alternative music" realm, who are very popular among the younger generations
- The lack of rehearsal rooms and recording is increasingly evident today



Literacy, readership and libraries

- Sharp increase in school enrolment rates (99% for 6-11 years in 2013 according to NIS)

I LEGISLATION

OTPDA (Tunisian Agency for the Protection of Copyrights)

Provides support to safeguard the economic and moral rights of member authors in the various literary, artistic and scientific fields

- It delivers the authorisations necessary for the use of the different works and ensures the obtaining of royalties due to authors
- It contributes to instilling the culture of copyrights

The steps initiated by the Ministry of Culture since early 2014 in this regard were to:



Organise an awareness campaign on the importance of literary property to the dissemination of the culture of safeguarding intellectual property (spring 2014)



Increase the interventions of qualified field officers who are committed to punish offenders (September - December 2014)



Develop cooperation with specialised international organisations and bodies (2016)
